**Qualifications:** applicants must have an MFA—or foreign equivalent—as well as a strong professional and academic record, and teaching experience beyond graduate school.

The ideal candidate will possess expertise in contemporary glass studio practice, emerging material technology and theory. This is a full-time position with two glass classes assigned per quarter at the beginning, intermediate and/or advanced level, and will actively collaborate in developing and initiating innovative curriculum and pedagogy at all levels of glass, 3D4M, and within the School's MFA community. They will participate fully in all 3D4M faculty responsibilities.
